




Feb 28 WRP Natural Resources Committee Webinar on the Mexican Wolf Recovery Program

- Presented by Sherry Barrett, Mexican Wolf Recovery Coordinator, U.S. Fish and Wildlife Service
- From 7 founding wolves, developed binational captive breeding population of 240- 300 wolves for release into the wild
- First wolves released in U.S. in 1998 and in México in 2011
- In 2016, there were a minimum of 113 wolves in wild in U.S.; fewer than 30 in México
- Proposing 2017 release of Mexican wolves from captivity into wild to reduce relatedness
- Mexican Wolf/Livestock Council providing depredation compensation and payments for presence to address economic effects of Mexican wolves on livestock; funding for proactive conflict avoidance
- Final recovery plan due November 2017


- Top 3 WRP-relevant issues within the region

Report:

- Survey results, quantitative in nature, of "top" Partner issues and needs within the WRP Region
- Relevant Committee efforts documenting their exploration of survey results on Partners' top issues and needs
- Identification of state and regional plans to commence in 2017-2020
- Helpful resources that encourage better collaboration among states, federal agencies and tribes within the WRP Region
- Identification of authoritative GIS data layers or web mapping services supportive of WRP planning efforts and initiatives
- Further recommendations for WRP Principals' consideration at the Ninth WRP Principals' meeting on identified gaps and possible focus areas that would lead to possible solutions

Survey Timeline

- November-December 2016: Interviews to seek input on survey questions
- December 2016: WRP SC and Committee Co-Chairs finalize survey questions on their Dec call
- January 26, 2017: Survey was sent to WRP SC & Committee Co-Chairs for their action (per December direction)
 - Input requested by February 10; follow up occurred throughout Feb
- March 9: Provided six weeks for response; survey "closed" in order to begin tabulating responses
- Responses provided by 33 WRP SC & Committee Co-Chairs from the following agencies:
 - States (Gov's Offices and agencies): AZ, CA, CO, NM, NV, UT
 - Federal Agencies: Army, BIA, BLM, BuREC, DOE, EPA, FAA, FEMA, FHWA, NPS, NRCS, NOAA, USAF, USFWS, USFS, USGS, USMC
 - NASAO, The Hopi Tribe






Ways for WRP to best communicate efforts & successes



 - In 2008, named Director of the newly-formed Basing Directorate (responsible for completion of the BRAC recommendations, U.S. and overseas basing, and real estate)
 - In 2016, named Principal Deputy ASD(EI&E) (career civilian deputy to the ASD(EI&E))
 - Bachelor of Arts degree in Biology and Master of Science degree in Systems Management
 - Served on active duty in the US Navy
