SIERRA ARMY DEPOT : CALIFORNIA

Sierra Army Depot (SIAD) is located in the high desert plains of the Sierra Nevada Mountains, in an isolated, arid region dominated by sagebrush. The community of Herlong, CA, surrounds the base. The closest major city to the depot is Reno, NV.



SIAD was established in 1942 as an ammunition storage facility. However, its mission changed in 2002. The depot offers a full range of logistics support by providing

asset receipt and visibility, classification, management, storage, distribution, maintenance, assembly and containerization, and the rapid worldwide shipment of material in support of the warfighter.

In 2014, SIAD had an estimated economic impact of \$443.3 million to the California and Nevada local economies.
