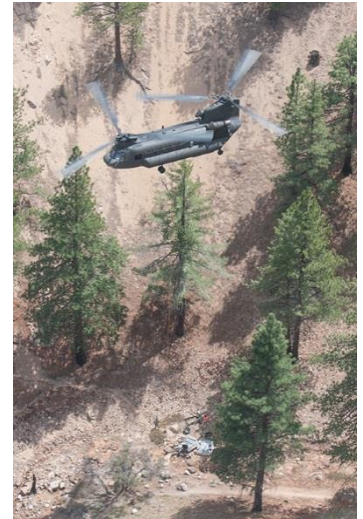


our force is the ability to provide high-quality military capabilities enhanced by the civilian skills, education, training, and experience of our Citizen-Soldiers.
