PRESIDIO OF MONTEREY : CALIFORNIA

The Presidio of Monterey is located in the City of Monterey, on the California coastline, about 117 miles south of San Francisco. The military has played an active role in the Monterey Peninsula since the area was "discovered" by Spanish explorers in the early 1600s. Although the Presidio dates back to the late 1700s, the Army did not build the current historic buildings present there until the early 1900s.



Today, the presidio's primary tenant organization is the Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center (DLIFLC), which trains soldiers from all branches of the Services in foreign language skills. DLIFLC includes eight

separate language schools and the Emerging Language Task Force. DLIFLC is highly regarded as one of the finest foreign language schools in the Nation.

The Presidio of Monterey has an economic impact of spending by the DLIFLC and NPS amounts to \$140.2 million channeled into the local economy, particularly through its educational institutions.

» Defense Language Institute Foreign Language Center (DLIFLC): Provides foreign language education, training, evaluation, and sustainment for Department of Defense personnel in order to ensure the success of the Defense Foreign Language Program and enhance the security of the Nation.

U.S. ARMY

- » 229th Military Intelligence Battalion: Provides the ready linguists for the U.S. Army. Includes Alpha Company, Bravo Company, Charlie Company, delta Company, Echo Company, and Foxtrot Company.
- » Marine Corps Detachment: Provides operational, administrative, and logistical support for Marine Corps personnel assigned for duty in the Monterey Peninsula area. Coordinate and integrate language training for Marines attending the Defense Language Institute in support of marine Corps regiments.

- » Air Force, 517th Training Group: Trains Airmen as linguists and develops Air Force skills and values.
