FALLON RANGE TRAINING COMPLEX : NEVADA

A component of Naval Air Station (NAS) Fallon, the Fallon Range Training Complex (FRTC) is located in the high desert of Nevada. Although FRTC has a Military Operations Area of 6.4



million acres, the Bureau of Land Management manages the majority of FRTC's land.

FRTC is a premier training facility for the Navy's carrier-based aviation units. These forces use the range primarily for pre-deployment training operations, with some capability to support research and development, and test and evaluation of military hardware,

personnel, tactics, munitions, explosives, and electronic combat. Fully 80% of all munitions dropped from Navy aircraft in training land on the FRTC.

In fiscal year 2008, NAS Fallon contributed approximately \$573 million to the regional economy.
